



West Greene School District Continues Technology Enhancements

West Greene School District was recently awarded the Pennsylvania Department of Education Enhancing Education Through Technology (EETT) grant to increase student achievement and success by providing state-of-the-art technological equipment and professional development. After a competitive submission and approval process, West Greene will receive \$76,397 in order to continue technology integration in classrooms across the district. EETT is an extension of the technology integration began by the Classrooms for the Future grant, which West Greene also used to incorporate laptops, interactive white boards, video projectors, wireless ports, printers, scanners, webcams, and other technology into their curriculum. “The EETT grant will allow us to continue to integrate the technology and training needed to provide the best possible educational experience for our students,” said Anthony Paull, principal at West Greene Middle-Senior High School. Full installation of EETT equipment is targeted for September 2010.
